### The EPA launches its 4<sup>th</sup> online course on the occasion of World Suicide Prevention Day



With the launch of "Focus on Suicidal Behaviours" on 10 September 2021 and on the occasion of World Suicide Prevention Day, the European Psychiatric Association adds a fourth online course to its expanding catalogue of virtual resources for mental health professionals all over the world.

Led by instructors Professor Emilie Olié and Professor Jorge López-Castromán, this most recent online course from the EPA also features 17 of the world's foremost experts in suicidology for an in-depth look at suicidal behaviour, its treatment, and its prevention.

Six thematic chapters cover topics ranging from public health and the advances of neurobiology to clinical assessment and optimal treatment. Learners can advance at their own rhythm and those who finish will receive a certificate of completion. Course instructors and expert speakers present the material in English with optional English subtitles.

Thanks to an unrestricted Educational Grant from Janssen Pharmaceutical Companies of Johnson & Johnson, "Focus on Suicidal Behaviours" is provided open access for all participants via the EPA e-Learning Platform.

### Prof. Emilie Olié - Lead Instructor

<u>Emilie Olié</u> is a Professor at the <u>Psychiatric Emergency and Post-Acute Care Department</u>, at the University Hospital of Montpellier (France). She received her PhD in 2010 from the University of Montpellier, France. She has been a member of the <u>Suicidology and Suicide</u> <u>Prevention Section</u> of the European Psychiatric Association for several years. She is co-chair of the section for study of suicidal behaviour (SECS) of the <u>French Association of Biological</u> <u>Psychiatry and Neuropharmacology</u> (AFPBN) and the co-chair of the National French Network for Bipolar Disorder Expertise (Fondamental Foundation).

As a member of the research team on 'Environment, Biomarkers, Neuropsychiatry' of the Functional Genomics Institute (IGF, Montpellier, France), she conducts clinical research on the role of pain in suicide and on the identification of suicidal biomarkers using neuropsychological and neuroimaging approaches in affective disorders. She has published more than 100 articles in international peer-reviewed journals and more than 20 book chapters on these topics.



### Prof. Jorge López Castromán - Lead Instructor

Jorge López-Castromán is a Professor of psychiatry at the University of Montpellier (France). He received his PhD in 2008 from the Autonomous University of Madrid (Spain). He is the current head of the <u>emergency and liaison psychiatry</u> and <u>child and adolescent</u> <u>psychiatry departments</u> at the University Hospital of Nimes (France). He has also been the co-chair of the <u>Suicidology and Suicide Prevention Section</u> of the European Psychiatric Association for several years.

His lines of research are organised around the improvement of assessment, prevention and treatment of suicidal behaviours and affective disorders. He has published more than 100 articles in international peer-reviewed journals and more than 10 book chapters. He participates as principal investigator or coordinator in several national and international projects. He is part of the research team on "Environment, Biomarkers, Neuropsychiatry!" of the Functional Genomics Institute in Montpellier, France, and CIBERSAM, Spain.
