## EPA ANNUAL REPORT 2022

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## EPA REBOOTS:

FIGHTING FOR BETTER AND MORE PROFESSIONAL MENTAL HEALTH CARE
At the beginning of 2022, with the COVID-19 pandemic beginning to come under control and the EPA preparing for a return to in-person meetings, it looked like life was control and the EPA preparing for a return to in-person meetings, it looked like life was
returning to normal. But on 24 February 2022 Russia attacked Ukraine - and Europe faced war once again
EPA immediately started its 'Network of Solidarity', gathering Ukrainian psychiatrists and NPA representatives from neighbouring countries on a regular monthly Zoom call.

In line with the wishes of the Ukrainian colleagues, we set up our 'Virtual Trauma Resource Centre', which is a virtual repository of documents to help professionals and the general public in treating and coping with traumatising events. We also organised 'Help for Helpers' webinars, which provided frontline helpers and volunteers with a psychological toolkit to support refugees fleeing their country because of the war. Thanks to donations received from our NPAs and from individual donors interested in supporting this work, we managed to finance and organise five deliveries of medication and one of electric generators to Ukrainian psychiatric hospitals.

At the same time, we continued our work on organising our annual Congress. In December 2021, as a result of the uncertainty caused by the new Omicron COVID-19 variant, we decided to postpone the 2022 Congress from April to June. We later had to make the extremely difficult decision to move to a fully virtual format, given the ongoing pandemic and the war in Ukraine.
Despite these challenges, our 2022 Congress was a great success. Held under the motto 'Linking Clinical Practice and Research for Better Mental Health Care in Europe', the Congress brought together almost 3,000 participants and gave them the opportunity to engage with state-of-the-art clinical tools, learn directly from experts, and explore innovative ideas for mental health care and prevention.
In parallel, the Task Forces implemented at the beginning of my Presidency were able to continue their work on our Core Guideline Project as well as finish our Map of Excellence Centres of Translational Research and our EPA White Paper on the Current and Future Treatment of Depression. We are also now finalising our papers on the Future of Diagnosis in Clinical Neurosciences and Digitalisation of European Psychiatry. With this work, we continue important discussions that foster better diagnostic and therapeutic care for people with mental illness.

In addition, EPA President-Elect Geert Dom has begun collaboration with UEMS to build a European Curriculum for Training in Psychiatry. He has also started working on a process to bring the EPA and the NPAs Council closer together to form an even stronger, more professional organisation for European psychiatry.

As we look ahead to 2023, I am particularly pleased that we will host, in March, our first in-person Congress since 2019
After three years of virtual meetings, it will be a pleasure to be able to meet again - and I look forward to welcoming you all to Paris.

## THE $30^{\text {TH }}$ EUROPEAN CONGRESS OF PSYCHIATRY

The $30^{\text {th }}$ European Congress of Psychiatry took place as a fully virtual meeting from 4 to 7 June 2022, welcoming over 2800 participants from more than 90 countries. Delegates were able to participate, learn and engage with experts and colleagues via a dedicated Congress platform.
Despite the unpredictable times, the EPA community came together to share good practices and to talk about the latest developments in psychiatry. Discussions at the event were guided by the motto ${ }^{\circ}$ Linking Clinical Practice and Research for Better Mental Health Care in Europe'.

## Scientific Programme

In 2022, for its third virtual Congress, the EPA built a scientific programme with rich and diverse content. The programme included three Plenary Lectures, six State of the Art Lectures, three Debates, 41 Symposia, 2000 Abstracts. 18 Oral Communication sessions and more than to top specialists in their field during 11 Ask the Expert sessions.
The Congress featured the second edition of EPA TV, with the association organising 15 sessions in which participants could get to know the EPA's leaders and invitees better.
With nine dedicated sessions throughout the congress, as well as a selection of 14 high-level EPA courses, the scientific programme has an important educational focus and is a reference for Early Career Psychiatrists. In total, 94 of these 147 sessions were held live and all of them remained available on-demand to congress participants for three months after the Congress.

$8^{\text {th }}$ Annual Forum
Under the title 'Mental Health in Europe: Care research and response in times of crisis', the Eighth EPA Forum focused on the role of research to improve mental health care and response in times of emergency. More than 600 participants joined the 2022 virtual Forum and were able to learn from an exceptional panel of speakers from international and U organisations.
Mr Stelios Kympouropoulos, a Greek Member of the European Parliament, opened the event and stressed the importance of establishing networks and raising awareness of mental health in Europe. The Forum was divided into three sessions: one centred around
the role of research in the field of mental health, a session on mental health policies and priorities in times of crisis and, for the last session, a roundtable discussion on the call for a European Year for Menta Health, a campaign launched by the MEP Alliance for Mental Health and GAMIAN-Europe.

## PUBLICATION COMMITTEE

The EPA Publication Committee is responsible for producing practical guidance papers and position statements on topics of interest to the mental health community and beyond.
The Publication Committee oversees the selection of topics, suggests the list of authors, prepares review procedures, and establishes the timeframe for publication and dissemination.
In 2022, discussions to streamline the revision process of guidance papers led to the establishment of a new system based on fou evaluation criteria: methodological quality; clinical relevance; originality; and format of the papers.

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The Publication Committee is reinventing itself to support the EPA in its mission to become the voice of psychiatry in Europe. From sharing clinical bestpractice guidance on assessing and treating negative symptoms in schizophrenia, to joint European policy illness, we continue to demonstrate that the EPA leads the way in times of complexity and change.

## STATEMENTS

EPA Statements on the situation in Ukraine
On 28 February 2022 the EPA released a statement calling for peaceful resolution of the war in Ukraine. This position statement was
quickly followed by two other statements in March, announcing the establishment of an "EPA Network of Solidarity for Ukraine' and setting out EPA actions to deal with the 'Ukraine Crisis'.
On 26 April 2022, the EPA issued a fourth statement on additional actions taken in light of the ongoing war in Ukraine. In June 2022, the EPA and the Committee on Ethical Issues issued a fifth statement and call for action to raise awareness of the mental health consequences of the war in Ukraine.
EPA statement on 'conversion therapies' and LGBTQ Patients

European Psychiatry continues to improve and develop following the move to a fully open access model in 2020. Over the years since the journal has published many important and influential papers; for example, one paper on the mental health consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic was cited more than 550 times and has been downloaded almost 50,000 times to date.
his strong performance is again reflected in increases in journal netrics. The journal Impact Factor grew by $33 \%$ from last year, with article downloads going up by $15 \%$, refiecting increasing impact and readership of the journal.
in 2023 and beyond the focus will be on development of the journal in terms of growth and author experience, as well as maintaining and improving its reputation as an extremely high-quality publication for researchers working in psychiatry.

## EU POLICY <br> \& LOBBYING

The consequences of the war in Ukraine, together with the mental health effect of the COVID-19 pandemic, placed the spotlight on the need to discuss mental health care and to make it a priority both at national and European level.
this context, the EPA acted as a plattorm for knowledge exchange mental health-related topics, and strengthened its position as a key mental health stakeholder at EU level.
The EPA's EU Policy and Lobbying activities focused on liaising with EU and international institutions, developing scientific collaborations, and
ngaging with the EPA Council of NPAS.

## AND INTERNATIONAL

 INSTITUTIONSSince September 2021 the EPA has been part of the WHO Pan-Europea Mental Health Coalition, a partnership dedicated to improving menta health across the WHO European Region. In 2022, EPA experts Prof. Geert Dom, Prof. Martina Rojnic Kuzman, Prof. Gabriela Stoppe, Prof udit Balasz and Prof. Ceciie Hanon participated in the two meeting organised by the Coalition and contributed to discussions on challenges

The EPA also joined the European Medicines Agency (EMA) Healthcare Professionals' Working Party (HCPWP) in 2022. The HCPWP is a platform
for exchanging information and discussing issues of common interest to for exchanging information and discussing issues of common interest to
the EMA and healthcare professionals. Under this framework, the EPA participated in relevant meetings in the area of medicines with other key stakeholders.
As in previous years, the EPA joined two meetings organised by GAMIAN-Europe and the MEP Alliance for Mental Health, held in May Falkai gave a presentation on the needs and challenges in terms of mental health care, stressing the need for a European Year for Mental Health and a comprehensive strategy for mental health at EU level.

Even in the most challenging times - with a pandemic and the ongoing war in Ukraine - social cohesion to strengthen the safety net, of which psychiatry is a vita component, should be a cross-European goal

Prof. Falkai also delivered a video keynote speech at the High-lev Conference on 'Resilient Mental Health in the EU', organised unde
the auspices of the Czech Presidency of the Council of the EU. At this Conference, held on 14 November in Brussels, Prof. Falkai addressed the important link between resilience and recovery.

As part of its advocacy activities, the EPA organised the annual Poil Jorum, preceding the official opening of the European Congress of Health in Europ. Care Research and Response in Times of Crisis Held virtually on 4 June, the event brought together more than 600 attendees and speakers from international and EU organisations who provided insights on the role of research to improve mental health care and response in times of emergency. The EPA Forum 2022 opened with a keynote address by Mr Stelios Kympouropoulos, a Member of the European Parliament, who highlighted the importance of establishing networks and raising awareness of mental health in Europe.


Developing scientific collaborations
2022, the EPA joined two Thematic Networks established under the EU Health Policy Platform (EU HPP). The Thematic Networks convene health stakeholders to produce joint statements addressed to the (coordinated by the European Public Health Alliance - EPHA) which seeks to address the impact of structural racism and discrimination on physical and mental health inequalities, and the Thematic Network on Mental Health in All Policies' (coordinated by Mental Health Europe).
The EPA fostered its scientific collaboration with the patient organisation GAMIAN-Europe. In 2022, the two Associations released a Report on he results of a survey conducted in 2021 on mental health services during the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition to this Report, GAM Trus Project, an initiative that involves both patients and clinicians to discuss care delivery in the area of schizophrenia.
As part of its participation in EU-funded projects in the mental health area, the EPA conducted communication and dissemination activities as part of three projects: the European Brain Research Area (EBRA), European Alliance for Sport and Mental Health (EASMH), and COMET, which looks at the situation for healthcare workers during the COVID-19 pandemic.

EBRA, led by the European Brain Council, came to an end in 2022 with final conference organised in October. The EPA provided support to th information on the project's activities and main achievements.
In January 2022, the EPA became a communication partner of the EASMH project, coordinated by ECOS, helping to raise awareness the link between sport and mental health (see photo on p14)
The COMET project, led by the Amsterdam Institute for Advanced Labour Studies and the Hugo Sinzheimer Institute (AIAS-HIS) kicked Union (EPSU) the EPA acts as communication patner in this proie which examines the relationship between the COVID-19 pandemic the nental health of healthcare workers, and trade union responses.
As part of its 2022 activities, the EPA strengthened its relationshi with other associations by signing Memoranda of Understanding with the Federation of European Neuroscience Societies (FENS) and the European Institute of Women Health (EIWH). The EPA also joined the Psychedelic Access and Research European Alliance (PAREA), a new multi-stakeholder partnership whose goal is to develop the treatment options.
In the framework of this collaboration, the EPA Executive Director Margaret Walker, participated in the first PAREA policy meeting at the European Parliament on 6 December 2022, centred around psychedelic-assisted therapies in the treatment of brain disorders (see photo above).

Finally the EPA appointed Prof Philin Gorwood (EPA Past President), as ember of the Board of Directors of the newly formed European Brain harity that seeks to support research aimed at reducing the burden of brain disorders in Europe.

## Engaging with the EPA Council

 of NPAsAs part of its Ambassadors Programme, the EPA involved the National Psychiatric Associations (NPAs) in the third edition of its Survey. Set up with the goal of establishing a database of information on mental heath practices and perspectives from around Europe and from within different mental health disciplines, the EPA Ambassadors Programm perates as a series of annual surveys distributed to mental heal

Following the successful surveys launched in 2020 and 2021, the 2022 questionnaire was focused on trauma-related treatment and diagnosis. $I$ collected neary 1,000 repies. An article based on the 2021 Surve esults was publis decisionaking styles and approaches adopted by mental health professionals in Europe.
As part of its collaboration with the NPAs, the EPA participated in oundtable discussions with representatives of the World Psychiatric ssociation (WPA) and the Slovak Psychiatric Association (SPA) in Slovakia avd prod the state-of-the-art of mental health service services. As a result of this action, the EPA sent an official letter to the Slovak Ministry of Health to inform its Office and Representatives about the findings of the roundtable discussions.

## EPA ACTIVITIES FOR UKRAINE

## COLLABORATION WITH OTHER SOCIETIES

The EPA made a concerted effort to support mental healthcare professionals and patients in Ukraine who faced extreme conditions because of the Russian invasion in February 2022.
As soon as the war started, the EPA issued statements to express its position and to Oukraine.
On 7 March 2022, the EPA established the EPA Network of Solidarity for Ukraine', an informal group of EPA representatives from
Ukraine and neighbouring countries aimed at developing a plan to help mental health professionals and the public cope with the mental health consequences of the war. Network participants met regularly throughout the year to discuss how to deliver mental healthcare services and what kind of support the EPA could provide.

As a result of the EPA Solidarity Network meetings, two main needs emerged:
The need for knowledge exchange and best practices on diagnosing and treating trauma and PTSD
The need for medicines and equipment
To address the needs that emerged as a consequence of the war, the EPA also undertook the following activities:

EPA Trauma Resource Centre In March 2022, the EPA launched a 'Trauma Resource Centre' on its website, compiling and storing relevant resources on how to cope win trauma and humanitarian emergencies. The Resource Centr
was regularly updated and materials were made available for bot healthcare professionals and the general public in English, Ukrainian, and Russian.


Help for Helpers' Webinars
In April 2022 the EPA organised three 'Help for Helpers' webinars to give frontline helpers and volunteers a psychological toolkit for helping refugees fleeing their country because of the war. The webinars were
recorded and translated in Ukrainian, Hungarian, Croatian, and Polish. recorded and transiated in Ukrainian, Hungarian, Croatian, and Poilish.
The video recordings were made accessible via the EPA Trauma Resource Centre. Resource Centre.

EPA Fund for Ukraine
The EPA also established a Fund for Ukraine to offer concrete support o mental healthcare professionals and their patients in hospitals in Ukraine. The EPA encouraged its NPAs and individual members to make donations to this special fund. The EPA President, Prof. Peter Falkai,
and the Chair of the EPA Council of NPAs, Prof. Jerzy Samochowiec, and the Chair of the EPA Council of NPAs, Prof. Jerry Samochowiec,
recorded a video message that was shared with NPA Presidents and recorded a viieo message that was shared with NPA Presidenis and
Representatives to encourage them to contribute to this initiative. Thanks to the support provided by its members and the Bavarian Parliament, the EPA collected donations that were used to purchase, collect, and deliver urgently needed medication to large psychiatric hospitals in Ukraine (see photos below).

ollowing a revamp of EPA Minds Online in 2021, the Association's mai ewsletter continues to go from strength to strength. Launched mor than a decade ago and distributed monthly to an audience of more than
15,000 subscribers, EPA Minds Online is a valuable communication too for the EPA, bringing together significant updates in one regular bulletin and ensuring a monthly 'touchpoint' with the wider EPA community. In 2022 we published eleven monthly issues of the newsletter. The

Toward the end of 2022 , open rates increased to more than 25 percent - we above average for such newsletters. ## FINANCES \& BUDGET

2022 marked the gradual return to in-person activities for the EPA, although the Congress, originally planned in hybrid format in Budapest, Hungary, was ultimately held virtually for the third consecutive time land Hungary, wa sutimately held virtually for the third consecutive time (and
postponed from the original March date to $4-7$ June, due to COVID-19). The difficult decision to move to the virtual format was made by the EPA The difficult decision to move to the virtual format was made by the EPA Ukraine spreading to neighbouring countries.
With 2,863 participants in total, the Congress yielded less income than in 2021. Expenditure went down considerably compared to the original forecast approved by the Board in March but was still highe committed to and could not be recouped. Nevertheless, and despite slightly reduced support from sponsors, the lower level of expenses enabled us to reach a better-than-anticipated final Congress surplus.
Income from membership fees remained stable while revenue from the EPA journal, European Psychiatry, showed a marked growth linked to inclusion of the journal in numerous package sales agreements with academic bodies.
The anticipated agreement regarding an unrestricted educational grant for e-learning did not materialise this year. The grant secured for the GEP exchange programme will be used in 2023 (and so is not credited
to 2022 income), as the placements resulting from the GEP 2022 call take place only in early 2023.

Expenses reflect the increasing level of in-person activities, especially during the second half of the year:
The EPA Summer school gathered 21 participants over three days in Strasbourg

- All Committee meetings were held in person over the Autumn
- In September 2022, the Executive Committee decided to hold a special joint Board-Council of NPAs meeting to allow in-deth discussion on proposed changes to the Council of NPAs structure and role, which
explains the increase in those two budget lines compared to the original Forecast. The meeting took place in Brussels in December.
EPA continued to invest in various tools which enabled the production of several webinars and surveys by various committees, including the NPAs Steering Committee

Conversely, expenditure on the office side was not only below that forecasted but lower than in previous years. This was due in part to corporate communications) in light of the deficito originally anticipated
colit and other factors:
The repayment of the loan taken out for the premises ended in 2022
One staff member was not replaced in 2022 and the planned recruitment of a science position was postponed to 2023.
Finally, as part of its efforts to support mental healthcare professionals and patients in Ukraine, the EPA set up a Solidarity Fund: of a total expenditure of almost $€ 4,000$, approximately $\in 2,500$ came from enerators made by EPA and distributed to Ukrinian psychiatric hospitals.
The different sources of income, and savings realised, enabled us to cover the activity-related expenses, leading to a balanced 2022 result. EPA Internal Auditors Mariana Pinto da Costa and Olivier Andlauer approved the 2022 annual accounts following the official Auditors'
meeting held virtually on 24 February 2023 .
