



## **Dr. Lieselotte Mahler**

### **Biography**



Lieselotte Mahler is Director of the Psychiatric Department of the Clinics in the Theodor-Wenzel-Werk in Berlin. She is the head of the social psychiatry and health services research group of the Department of Psychiatry and Neurosciences at Charité Berlin and has been conducting research on reduction of coercion in acute psychiatry for over 10 years.

Lieselotte Mahler has published numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals (see <https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/?term=lieselotte+mahler>) and several books. In particular, she has developed the 'Weddinger Modell', a recovery-oriented psychiatric concept that leads to a significant reduction in coercive measures, as well as a standardized guideline for post-coercive review sessions with patients, which has been well evaluated in terms of reducing the negative consequences of coercion.
